While the internet is a wonderful tool for researching, it is often littered with errant information. Below you find a few of the trusted websites I frequent. They have free resources and some offer subscription services as upgrades.

Education

I believe gaining an education is a wonderful thing. <u>Torah Resource Institute</u> would be my recommendation. For the last six years I have been at work in their Advanced Biblical Studies program and am currently writing my thesis. This year, they changed their format to a self-paced study program from a traditional quarter structure to accommodate a variety of schedules and time zones around the world. You still have access to instructors and forum in which to discuss class lectures and reading. They still offer live language classes.

For a plethora of free articles and study materials, <u>Torah Resource</u> has you covered. They also sell Bible studies and video teachings. They also have an annual library membership.

Ariel Berkowitz, who was one of my teachers, is wonderful! If you love History and Geography, the Ancient Near East and Archaeology, you will love his classes which can be taken at Torah Resource or visit him at his website <u>Torah Resource International</u>.

Research

Two places I use for research when I need peer reviewed and published papers are <u>Jstor</u> and <u>Academia</u>. Both can be accessed for free with limited reading and downloads; both have a subscription for full access.

I like this online Bibles: <u>Bible Gateway</u> and it offers reading in all versions. <u>Bible Hub</u> is a great tool for comparing differing versions of Scripture. I also love <u>Got Questions</u>: they link everything back Scripture and give great cross references so you can study it for yourself.

Software

Additionally, I own and use <u>Accordance Bible software</u>. They have a variety of packages to suit a variety of needs. I find it to be more user friendly than <u>Logos</u>. Both have free versions.
